The Anglo-Russian Agreement of 1907 therefore became the expression of several new trends: it was first a sequel to the admission of Britain into the Franco-Russian alignment following the establishment of the Entente Cordiale; it was the definite expression of the *détente* in Anglo-Russian relations throughout the Middle East; and it was a defensive reaction to the growing German control over Turkish life and to the German penetration into Persia.
