ARMENIANS OCCUPY ERIVAN.

ANATOLIA, July 5.—A Vienna telegram to the *Zohlanzeiger* quotes a Kieff paper, which reports from Tiflis that Armenian forces, 25,000 strong, have occupied Erivan, 173 miles south-south-west of Tiflis. The relations between the Turks and the Armenians, it is stated, have recently become still worse.—Press Association.
