

During that session of the Parliament, a major reorganization of Khatisian's cabinet was confirmed, giving the Dashnaktsutun a stronger, more direct role. Hamazasp Ohandjanian, who had recently returned from serving with Avetis Aharonian in Paris, assumed the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Ruben Ter-Minasian became minister of military affairs (war) in a move that heartened Armenian militants; Arshak Djamalian, former envoy in Tiflis and a fiery internationalist, was named minister of communications; and Simon Vratzian, a member of the party Bureau and an editor of the central organ, *Haradj*, began his tenure as minister of labor and of agriculture. For the first time since the creation of the Armenian republic, the entire cabinet was composed of Dashnakists:
